Pattullo Lecture

Wednesday, 1:00pm

Gary Filerman was the first executive of AUPHA, a position he held for 28 years (1965-1993). He also served as the first executive of the accrediting commission (1968-1982). Gary was the founding editor of the Journal of Health Administration Education and a co-founder of the Health Administration Press.

Dr. Filerman has been associated with the Pew Charitable Trusts, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, The Brookings Institution, the Academy for Educational Development, W. K. Kellogg Foundation, the World Bank, International Finance Corporation, Pan American Health Organization and USAID among others. His health services administration education and management development work has taken him to over 40 countries. He serves on several boards, including the Accrediting Council on Continuing Medical Education (ACCME).

Dr. Filerman's academic career included two years as professor and interim chair of George Washington University's Department of Health Care Management and Policy and nine years as professor and chair of the Georgetown Department of Health Services Administration. The author of 85 publications, he earned his BA, MHA, MA and Ph.D at the University of Minnesota and is a recipient of the University Regent's Distinguished Contribution award.

Dr. Filerman is the president of the Atlas Health Foundation, a 501(c)3 organization that is working with the leading national health services organizations to connect rural veterans with jobs in rural health services.

Anthony Coletta, MD, MBA, is this year's Forum speaker. Dr. Coletta is executive vice president and president of Facilitated Health Networks at Independence Blue Cross (Independence), where he leads the development of Independence's strategic relationships with physicians and health systems, innovative provider contracts, and sophisticated informatics and predictive analytics capabilities to drive improvements in health care quality and costs.

Dr. Coletta has gained a wealth of healthcare related experience serving in a diverse set of roles throughout his career. Among other leadership roles, he has served as the chief executive officer of Tandigm Health and executive vice president and chief medical officer of Holy Redeemer Health System. In addition, Dr. Coletta was an attending general surgeon for more than two decades at Bryn Mawr Hospital, an associate clinical professor of surgery at Drexel University in Philadelphia, and, since 2007, has volunteered as a surgical missionary to Haiti, traveling to the island annually with medical supplies and a team of physicians.

Dr. Coletta is a Fellow in the American College of Surgeons, a member of the Board of Trustees of Cristo Rey Philadelphia High School, and the chairman of the Board of Managers for Tandigm Health. Dr. Coletta received his Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry at Georgetown University and graduated from Thomas Jefferson Medical College. In addition, he obtained his Master of Business Administration degree from the Fox School of Business at Temple University, an AUPHA member, in 2006 with the distinction of University Scholar.

Getting around

Philadelphia is one of the most walkable cities in the nation, but it also has a top-notch mass transit system and more.

Get oriented: Thanks to founder William Penn's smart and simple grid street design, the heart of the city is easy to navigate. The Schuylkill and Delaware rivers border Center City's 25 blocks on the west and east. Keep in mind that, south of Market Street, streets running east and west are named after trees while north and south streets are numbered. Check out the printable [Center City map \(pdf\)](#) or view our [interactive city map](#) for more information.

Walking: First-rate dining, arts and entertainment, famous historic sites and tax-free clothing and shoes shopping are within steps of Center City hotels, so you will save on transportation. As you walk, you will notice color-coded

directional signs that let you know what district you're in and point you toward area attractions. Look for [Center City District's](#) goodwill ambassadors, dressed in teal uniforms and equipped with maps, who are happy to give directions and answer questions.

Public transportation: Base cash fare for [SEPTA](#) buses, trolleys, and subways is \$2.50; transfers are \$1. Get the SEPTA Key Card and put money in the Travel Wallet and enjoy the discounted \$2 fare when you tap to ride. For families on the go, the best travel value is the One Day Family Independence Pass for \$30 (good for up to 5 people traveling together). Sightseeing solo? Try the One Day Individual Independence Pass for \$13. Both provide unlimited travel on all SEPTA modes of transportation for a full day.

Cab: There are more than 1,800 licensed and trained cabs in Philadelphia or download the [Uber app](#) to order a town car to your location.

[Philly PHLASH](#) is the city's seasonal transportation loop that makes it easy and convenient to get around to Philadelphia's most popular attractions. An all-day bus pass costs \$5.

By Bike/Segway: Check out [Wheel Fun Rentals](#) and [Philadelphia Segway Tours](#) for more information, or participate in Philly's bike share program, [Indego](#). With more than 100 stations located throughout the city, go for a ride and explore Philadelphia, then return your rented bike to any station location.

Getting there

Only 100 miles from New York City and 130 miles from Washington, D.C., Philadelphia is in the center of it all.

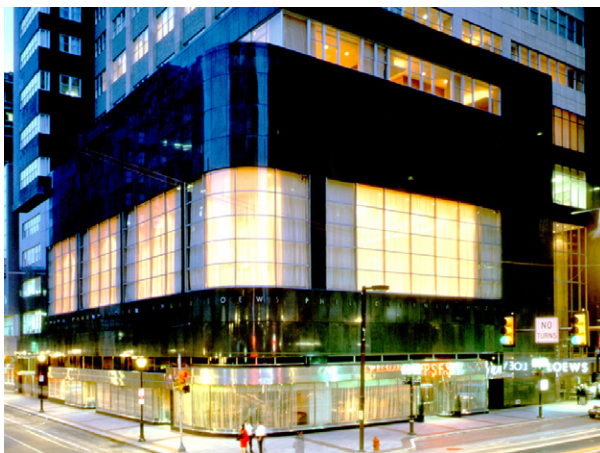
By plane: There are more than 525 daily nonstop flights to PHL. Once you are here, it's a 25-minute ride on the SEPTA Airport Line right at the airport or a 10-minute ride in a taxi to cover the seven miles from [Philadelphia International Airport](#) to Center City. SEPTA's Airport Line leaves every 30 minutes, and a one-way fare is \$6.75 when you purchase a Quick Trip from the Fare Kiosk on the platform. The taxi ride costs a flat rate of \$28.50 (at press time). [Click here](#) or call the Airport Ground Transportation Hotline at 215-937-6958 for information on other ground transportation options.

By train: Amtrak Acela and commuter trains arrive at historic [30th Street Station](#) throughout the day, placing passengers within a short walk of Center City. Philadelphia is only 1 hour and 20 minutes from New York City and 1 hour and 45 minutes from Washington, D.C., via Acela Express.

By bus: Megabus offers low-cost express bus routes throughout the Northeast Corridor.

By car: Almost half of the U.S. population is within a day's drive of Philadelphia. Interstates 95 and 76, and the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Turnpikes, provide access from all points on the compass. Once you arrive, there are more than 40 parking lots and garages in Center City. AUPHA's 2018 Annual Meeting will be held at the elegant Loews Philadelphia Hotel. Opened in 2000, the Hotel was the former Philadelphia Savings Fund Society (PSFS), the first savings bank in the United States. The building is considered one of the most significant buildings of the 20th century and the second skyscraper to have central air-conditioning. The building was built in the midst of the Great Depression at an estimated cost of \$8 million and was opened in stages between 1932 and 1933. The \$8 million cost was an enormous amount during the Depression, and nearly impossible to afford today.

The special sleeping room rate is \$199 plus occupancy tax. Because we anticipate our 70th anniversary Annual Meeting to be well attended, you are encouraged to make your reservations soon.
